Over 2,000 years ago, in a cave in Bethlehem, a family found shelter, and a baby was born who would change the world. 65 years ago, the people of St. Anselm's

celebrated their first Christmas in this sanctuary, and ever since, we've been a spiritual home for seekers of all ages, a place and people committed to celebrating the life and teachings of Jesus so that, together, we too might change the world. Whether this is your first time or you have been here many times, please know you are warmly welcome, and we pray that you may find a home with us.

Restrooms are located next door in the Parish Hall. Children are a blessing and encouraged to participate in worship alongside their parents. On the left of the sanctuary is an area with toys, coloring sheets, and crayons.

The people's responses are in bold. All hymns can be found in the Blue Hymnal. This type of note, offering direction about the service, is called a "rubric," which comes from the Latin word rubrics (red) - referring to a time when these instructional notes were always written in red.

The photo to the left was taken in April 2023 at the Church of the Nativity in Bethlehem.


### **PRELUDE**

### WELCOME & OPENING PRAYER

**Narrator**: The nativity of our Lord Jesus Christ, according to the Gospel writings of St. Luke and St. Matthew.

**Narrator**: Now the birth of Jesus took place in this way: In those days a decree went out from Emperor Augustus that all the world should be registered. This was the first registration and was taken while Quirinius was governor of Syria. And all went to their own towns to be registered.



And she gave birth to her firstborn son and wrapped him in swaddling cloths, and laid him in a manger, because there was no place for them in the inn.


### H# 101 "Away in A Manger"

**Narrator**: And in that region there were shepherds living in the fields, keeping watch over their flock by night.

**Narrator**: And behold, an angel of the Lord stood before them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were terrified.

Narrator: And the angel said to them, (holds mic for Gabriel)

**Gabriel**: Do not be afraid; for I am bringing you good news of great joy for all people! To you is born this day in the city of David a savior, who is the Messiah, the Lord!


**Narrator**: And suddenly there was with the angel a multitude of the heavenly host praising God and saying: "Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace, goodwill toward men!"

**Narrator**: When the angels had left them, the shepherds said to one another, "Let us go now to Bethlehem and see this thing that has taken place, which the Lord has made known to us." So they went with haste and found Mary and Joseph, and the child lying in the manger.





Mary and Joseph hold the baby and greet the angles and shepherds (Nobody takes the stage at this point)


**Narrator**: Now after Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea in the days of King Herod, behold, wise men from the East came to Jerusalem, saying, "Where is he who has been born King of the Jews? For we have seen his star in the East and have come to worship him."

**Narrator**: When they saw that the star had stopped, they were overwhelmed with joy. And when they had come into the house, they saw the young child with Mary his mother, and fell down and worshiped him. Then, opening their treasure-chests, they offered him gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh. And having been warned in a dream not to return to Herod, they left for their own country by another road.


