Yesterday's Pentecost service was one like no other. It really didn't hit me until the liturgy started. For fourteen months there have been no congregational responses. It was wonderful to have a shared liturgy *in the church*!

Chris Young and Cathy Witkay put in extra effort to make it happen. We were approved for reopening on Thursday afternoon, and by Friday we were all ready, with social distancing and safety protocols in place.

There were some minor glitches, and we are still figuring out how we will coordinate a remote and an in-church gathering. But I have to say, the social distancing and mask wearing didn't impact us too much.

Paul Witkay surprised everyone by delivering individual containers of coffee and baked goods after the service, and we had a congenial and safe visit in the courtyard.

I know that many of us would like to return to the schedule of two services at 8 and 10 a.m. All 10 o'clockers should know that independent of Andrew and Caroline's move, we will not likely be having music any time soon as singing in church is likely to be one of the last things allowed before a return to normal. The vestry and choir are considering next steps for the music program.

In the short term, the barrier to returning to our former schedule is that there are presently mandated cleaning requirements between services which basically make doing so a non-starter. However, as with social distancing, mask-wearing and gathering indoors for shared meals, if things continue to progress well, those mandates will hopefully be lifted soon.

If you are on the fence about coming back to church, I encourage you to give it a try. You might be surprised, like I was, at just how much you have missed church.

ALTAR FLOWERS


