We may have fears about the future and the changes, but let us not be the fears and let us not create a world in which these fears dominate the conditions of our world.

I am excited to be joining you in mutual ministry as the next Rector of St. Anselm's Episcopal Church! My wife, Eileen, and I loved meeting with your Vestry, and we appreciated the hospitality extended to us during our visit.


Michael Lane Preschool Update

Vestry Meeting Update


At the May 15 Vestry meeting our primary discussion items included:
