# From Rev. Will

Dear St. Anselm's,

With April now upon us and Easter around the corner, it is tempting to fast-forward through these remaining days of Lent, but the church, in her wisdom, invites us to stay present to the unfolding story of Jesus. This Sunday, we will reflect on Jesus' visit to the home of Mary, Martha, and Lazarus from John's gospel and Mary's extravagant gift, anointing Jesus' feet with costly perfume. On Palm Sunday, we'll join the crowd waving palm branches as we process into the church singing "Hosanna" and then be reminded of how quickly celebration shifted to lamentation.



In these challenging times for our nation and world, showing up for church and prayerfully considering these ancient stories will not remove the frustration, anger, grief, heartache, fear, anxiety, and pain so many of us feel. Doing so, though, will remind us that we are not alone and that we walk the way of Jesus together.

I am looking forward to sharing Holy Week and Easter with you. Below, you will find details about the services we have planned. Thank you to St. Anselm's Altar Guild, Director of Music & Choir, and Worship Commission for all they do to support our engagement with these sacred liturgies.

#### **Palm Sunday**

April 13th at 10 a.m.

The service will begin on our front patio with a blessing of palm branches and a procession into the sanctuary, followed by a reading of the Passion from Luke's gospel.

#### **Maundy Thursday**

April 17th at Noon

The service will begin in the Parish Hall with a light Mediterranean-inspired meal, conversation about the readings, optional foot washing, and communion in the sanctuary.

#### **Good Friday**

April 18th at Noon

This service will include a reading of the Passion from John's Gospel, the Solemn Collects, and close with the Stations of the Cross.

#### **Easter Sunday**

April 20th at 10 a.m.

This celebratory service will include traditional Easter hymns, a homily, and communion. An Easter Egg Hunt will begin immediately following the service at 11:15 a.m.
