

Dear St. Anselm's,

Blessed Advent to you and yours!

Here's some of what I shared in last Sunday's sermon:

A couple I know sends each other emails throughout the day. Most of the emails are forwarded news articles, they think their partner would like to know about—Senator Blabla has said such and such isn't that wonderful, or Congresswoman So & So has said blabla isn't that terrible. Occasionally, amid the deluge of news stories, one member of the couple will send the other an email with a subject line like "Important Urgent Announcement" or "Earth-shattering news story." Within the message, he will write "I love you." This loving gesture came to mind as I considered this week's texts and thought of Advent. The season of preparation, of awaiting the day of the Lord's coming---at Christmas, in our daily lives, and in the fullness of all time...

Advent, like that couple's email --- comes at us in the midst of our broken world, in a nation seemingly fueled more by the pursuit of power than the pursuit of love. Advent comes to us, with the subject line "Important Urgent Announcement" or "Earth-shattering news story." God loves you, and hope is on the way.

Advent at St. Anselm's this year will offer people of all ages time to reflect, deepen in our faith, and seek out light in the darkness. On December 24th at 5 p.m., we'll gather around the altar for our annual Christmas Eve Candlelight service, featuring

traditional carols and Holy Communion. What a gift to seek the light of Christ in the darkness of our world with you at St. Anselm's.

# **Vestry Update**

Vestry Meeting held November 16th:

The Minutes from the October 19th meeting were approved and posted in the Parish Hall Conference Room

The vestry had an interactive discussion:

Katie Taggart provided a Stewardship Wrap-Up

Marian Mulkey provided a 2026 Draft Budget Presentation, and the vestry approved the Budget for 2026 based on pledges received to date and expenses incurred in 2025. The vestry is committed to sticking to the budget and working to do better than the projected \$12,000 deficit.

Katie Taggart and Julia Starr collaborated to create a process to evaluate large events to determine their "value" in relation to "effort and expense".

We have a new website domain name - stanselmslafayette.org which will be replacing the old domain name in the near future.

#### Action Items:

The 2026 clergy Housing Exemption was presented, discussed and approved.

It was approved that Undesignated Memorial Gifts will automatically be transferred to the Endowment Fund. We will continue to honor specifically designated bequests.

The vestry approved accepting Installment Payments for the purchase of niches in the Columbarium.

#### Updates:

Outreach - November & December we will purchase gifts for the clients of OTTP - Occupational Therapy Training Program and collect food for the Contra Costa Food Bank.

Deacon Report - Naomi is going to pilot a program on the 1st Sundays of the month by attending services online and offering a virtual coffee hour to connect with the online community.




# Celebrate The Work of Trinity Center This Holiday Season!

Each Holiday season since 2014, St. Anselm's has provided support to Trinity Center and their lifeline to the working poor and homeless. Through these annual "Harvest Festival" Holiday campaigns St. Anselm's has raised over \$500k to provide shelter, meals, hope and a "Doorway to opportunity" for the poorest and most vulnerable in our community.

2025 has been a breakout year for Trinity Center's growth and progress at helping those in need within our community. TC impacts lives and provides a way forward for the many who shelter each weekday, socialize, wash clothes, take showers, eat meals and get help finding jobs, housing, medical services and counseling. **Housing Placements** 





Each week TC provides **daytime shelter for 382** clients, serves **462 hot meals** and provides **480 articles of clothing**. During the rainy, cold months TC & the City of Walnut Creek sponsor a winter-long shelter from cold and rainy weather at the Walnut Creek Armory. This program reduces exposure from sleeping outside during cold, inclement weather and saves lives.


