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Vestry Update

Our June Vestry meeting was held on Monday evening, June 16, beginning with a wonderful potluck dinner and followed by a productive and focused meeting. Here's a summary of what was discussed:

Strategic Planning

We reviewed the outcomes of the 3-Year Planning Exercise conducted during our April Vestry Retreat. The focus remained on three key areas of concern:

· Attracting Families and Young People

· Team Development, Recruitment, and Engagement

· Property Improvements

For each area, the vestry discussed concrete next steps to move forward with action plans.

Property Updates

We addressed several immediate and long-term property concerns:

• Parish Hall Plumbing Repair: The current situation and a bid from Roto-Rooter were reviewed. The vestry approved obtaining two additional bids. The Property Commission will review all bids and determine the best course of action.

• Parking Lot Resealing: It was approved to proceed this summer with the recommended company, based on the Property Commission's evaluation of material quality, durability, and cost.

• Other Property Issues Discussed:

§ Fire Safety and Defensible Space work

§ Fire Alarm System

§ Interior and Exterior Lighting

Following extensive discussion, the vestry agreed on the following action items:

1. Develop a comprehensive vision and plan for the entire church property

2. Gather more detailed cost information for various projects

3. Prioritize the list of capital projects

4. Begin preparing for a Capital Campaign to launch in early 2026

Financial Resolutions

 \cdot Account Consolidation: A resolution was passed to close and consolidate all auxiliary bank accounts (including Columbarium and Altar Guild) into the main St. Anselm's Mechanics Bank checking account.

• Preschool Accounts: Another resolution was approved to establish separate checking and reserve accounts for Michael Lane Preschool at Mechanics Bank. This change, recommended by our bookkeeper and prior audits, will go into effect in August 2025 to improve clarity and compliance.

Their mission is to alleviate hunger in homeless communities by empowering middle and high school students as they prepare and provide meals. He organizes students to prepare bagged lunches that they then distribute throughout Oakland to people in the homeless communities. We will collect non-perishable items and decorate bags to put the food items in and then pass them on the Brett to distribute. Please note all items should be individual size portions - think snack size.
