#### From Rev. Will

Dear St. Anselm's,

As we step into September, I am filled with gratitude for the many ways the Holy Spirit is moving in our lives together. Back in July, I preached at our sibling church (architecturally speaking) on the other side of the country, the Chapel of St. James the Fisherman in Wellfleet, Massachusetts. As we prepare to celebrate our 65th Anniversary on October 26th and welcome the Very Rev. Tracey Lind, a gifted priest who has served the Chapel in Wellfleet for over a decade, I thought I'd share a few words from my sermon. The Christianity that our shared in-the-round architecture nurtures is one of humble engagement, earnest participation, openness to wonder, simple beauty, and mutual vulnerability. These two structures on either coast are modest, but their visions, purposes, and impact are not. They were built by people who had seen grief and hard times, who, though flawed, confronted societal wrongs with grace and courage, imagining a world that welcomed diversity and collaboration, leaders that served the people, who built churches not to create private exclusive clubs but to reconstitute the world by joining and strengthening causes and serving others...

In other words, a church in the round isn't just a design statement. It's also a theological one. .

The husband-and-wife team of Charles and Ray Eames, who were connected with Marianne Strengel and Olav Hammarstrom's (the architect of our two churches) at Cranbrook, had a motto for their now-famous company: "the best for the least for the most."

That line, which I first heard in The Shores of Bohemia, a book about this region of Cape Cod, has been sitting with me as I prepared to join you this morning, as I think perhaps about what motivated the founders of both our communities. What drove them was a healthy aspirational sense that we human beings can when we are truly at or giving our best, can do the most for the least, and for everyone.

The best for the least for the most, churches with a cause, not clubs with special seats, but people seeking to serve.



A Stephen Minister is a well-trained caregiver who listens, cares, prays, encourages, and offers the love of Christ during a time of need. Stephen Ministers understand that Christ is the "cure-giver" and Stephen Ministers are the Caregivers. A Stephen Minister is there to walk beside a person facing difficulties such as divorce, serious illness, loss of spouse, job loss, and much more. ## **Vestry Update**

#### July 20th Vestry Meeting:

- The vestry reviewed, discussed and approved the mid year financial report submitted by Marian Mulkey, Treasurer
- The vestry reviewed, discussed and approved changes for Michael Lane Preschool applying to Licensing to for a change in the duration of operating hours to 2 p.m. and also lowering the admittance age for children from 2 years 9 months to 2 years old.
- Joni Pearce updated the vestry about Outreach
  - ♦ Winter Nights is happening September 29th through October 6th and she will be asking for volunteers soon.
  - ◆ The vestry agreed to join the Contra Costa Interfaith Council annual dues of \$200
  - Laundry Love is a program to help unhoused people get their laundry done and the vestry agreed to do a fundraiser for this organization in the fall.
  - Outreach will start having monthly Zoom meetings where all are welcome to come with ideas beginning soon
  - ♦ The vestry has instituted the compilation of an "Institutional Knowledge Binder" to pull together historical information about St. Anselm's so that information does not get lost.
  - ◆ The Stewardship Campaign will be held October 5th through October 26th
  - Property Commission gave several updates:
  - The vestry approved hiring Letts Plumbing and Ron's Carpet Detail to fix the plumbing problem in the parish hall
  - The vestry approved hiring Jesus Lopez to clear and fireproof the plantings on the back hillside
  - ♦ The bee situation is being addressed with local bee keepers and Verizon as they want to upgrade some equipment in the bell tower right where the bees have their home.
  - ♦ The parking lot has been sealed
  - We received an insurance payout for the damaged solar panels on the roof of the parish hall
  - Parish Life will be throwing a Summer Parish/Preschool Picnic August 16th from 4-6 p.m.
  - The vestry approved starting monthly Family Sundays the first Sunday in September.
- The 3<sup>rd</sup> Annual Lamorinda Public Safety Day will be held October 18<sup>th</sup> from 9-11 a.m.

#### August 17th Vestry Meeting:

- The Summer Parish/Preschool Picnic was very successful and it was decided that this will become an annual event.
- The vestry discussed painting the front door of the sanctuary to make it stand out more and make it easier to find the entrance of the sanctuary. It is being referred to the Property Commission.
- The vestry discussed and approved to start exploring a Capital Campaign for repairs and updates to the entire St. Anselm's campus. It was agreed that the formation of a committee will be conducted between now and the end of the year.
- Sunday, October 26<sup>th</sup> will be the 65<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Celebration for St. Anselm's including the culmination of the Steward-ship Campaign/Ingathering Sunday, Brunch, and special guests.
- Updating the audio for the choir/zoom with 2 new microphones was approved and will be completed for the return of the Choir in the fall.
- Michael Lane Preschool has been approved by Licensing to take children as young as 2 years old and extend the day to 2 p.m. They have already increased their enrollment after approval.
- Property Commission Update:
  - The plumbing problem has been fixed in the parish hall.
  - The clearing of the back hillside was completed.
- The Rummage Sale goods have been piling up and we need to find more room to store donated items.

## 65TH Anniversary Guest Preacher: The Very Rev. Tracey Lind

On Sunday, October 26th St. Anselm's will celebrate 65 years since our dedication on October 22, 1960 and will welcome the Very Rev. Tracey Lind as guest preacher. Tracey has served for over 10 years as Priest-in-Charge of our architectural sibling, the Chapel of St. James the Fisherman in Wellfleet, Massachusetts.

Tracey is an Episcopal priest, community activist, and retired Dean of Trinity Cathedral, Cleveland Ohio's oldest church. Previously, she served as Rector of St. Paul's Episcopal Church in Paterson, NJ and Associate Rector of Christ Episcopal Church in Ridgewood, NJ.



A graduate of the Union Theological Seminary in NYC, Tracey has spent over thirty-five years in ordained ministry working for interfaith relations, social and environmental justice, sustainable urban development, arts and culture, and progressive theology. Most recently, her ministry extended to include the spiritual insights and lessons she has gained from a life complicated by early-onset dementia.

Tracey is a renowned preacher who has spoken in a variety of national pulpits, including the Chautauqua Institution. In 2014, she presented a widely viewed TEDx Talk entitled "How I Met God in a McDonald's," and in 2018, she and her spouse Emily Ingalls were featured in a 60 Minutes episode on FTD. Tracey is an exhibiting photographer, an enthusiastic folk musician, an avid gardener, a struggling golfer, and an adventuresome swimmer, hiker, cyclist, sailor and traveler. Tracey and Emily live in Cleveland Heights, Ohio. In the summer, they reside in Wellfleet, and in the winter, they escape for a couple of months to Luquillo, Puerto Rico.


