# From The Interim Rector

## Casting Lots

"And they cast lots for them, and the lot fell on Matthias; and he was added to the eleven apostles." (Acts 1:26)

In the Book of Acts, after Jesus has commissioned his followers to be his witnesses "to the ends of the earth" and been carried away from them up into heaven, the eleven apostles stayed together in Jerusalem where they "were constantly devoting themselves to prayer" (Acts 1:14). "In those days," as Acts puts it, Peter stands up among the believers, who total around one hundred twenty persons, and tells them that, with Judas gone, they must find another person to take his place. One of the people who has been with them during the time Jesus was among them "must become a witness with us to his resurrection," he says.

"So they proposed two, Joseph called Barsabbas, who was also known as Justus, and Matthias. Then they prayed and said, 'Lord, you know everyone's heart. Show us which one of these two you have chosen to take the place in this ministry and apostleship from which Judas turned aside to go to his own place.' And they cast lots for them, and the lot fell on Matthias; and he was added to the eleven apostles." (Acts 1:23-26)

They cast lots, and the lot fell on Matthias. Casting lots is certainly one way of choosing a new leader in the Church. It is quite a lot simpler and faster than the process we use these days for selecting a new rector. We will never know whether it was more or less effective, as Matthias is never mentioned again in the New Testament. Either way, the search process could not be more different than our own, with a search committee, parish assessment, parish profile and OTM, multiple rounds of interviews, and a vestry election.

But when it comes to selecting a new leader in the Church, there are a couple of important lessons we should take from the process these first Christians used:

First, Luke (the author of Acts) tells us that they stayed together! At a time when it would have been easy for most of them to fall away, or find another person to follow, they stuck together. We must stick together, too! It is common, even normal, for parishioners to leave during an interim period. The leader they know is gone, and things are both different and uncertain, so they go somewhere else or go nowhere. But St. Anselm's ability to move successfully through and thrive during this interim time depends upon all of us staying in this together, remaining with each other and for each other.

Second, they prayed! As a community they "were constantly devoting themselves to prayer." And, when it came time to select someone to replace Judas, they asked for God's guidance. "Show us which one of these two you (*Continued on page 5*)

have chosen..." So, we must individually and collectively continue to pray -- for our church, for each other, for our search committee, for God's direction.

Third, they trusted God! The act of casting lots may seem to us the equivalent of the roll of the dice, which leads to a random result. In the Old Testament, however, lots were cast for important decisions (for example, the division of land among the twelve tribes of Israel). According to Proverbs, "The lot is cast into the lap, but the decision is the Lord's alone" (16:33). In New Testament times, too, casting lots was believed to be a determinant of God's will. So, we know by their casting of lots that the disciples never lost sight of the fact that God was with them and was part of the process. God is part of our search process, too. So, as we pray for God's direction, let us also pray for the wisdom and courage to recognize and follow it.

The rector search process is a long and challenging one. So, as our gets into full swing, let us continue to stay together and to pray together, trusting that God is with us, and is guiding us toward just the right person and just the right future for St. Anselm's.


